
Likely bird strikes at home: none.

Note: the chart displays the number of days in a given month in which the species were seen. On any given day, an individual or a small flock of birds were seen. In the case of grebes, local rarities, a single bird is seen along a water course (ranging from the Trent river to a small creek) during each infrequent sighting. The pied-billed grebe and horned grebe are quite distinct. The eared grebe, which mostly occurs west of Ontario, might be confused with the horned grebe.
